

discharged. Two of Willie's brothers served in the Federal 3rd Potomac Home Brigade of Maryland Infantry during the war, one of whom was mortally wounded near Frederick in 1864. Postwar he was a minister for the Southern Methodist Episcopal Church and died in 1879, age 41.

MCCLURE, GEORGE DOUGLAS ("DOUG"): B. at Bunker Hill, VA, 2/25/1840. 1860 cen.: res. 15th Ward, Baltimore City, age 20, clerk, s., lived with his parents and six siblings. Enl. 4/1/1862 for war at Fort Lowry, VA. Adm. to G.H. No. 21 5/14/1862, mumps. RTD 5/22/1862. Adm. to G.H. No. 21 7/18/1862, typhoid fever. RTD 7/25/1862. AWOL 11/1/1863. Cptd. at Payne's Farm 11/27/1863 and sent to Ft. Delaware. OOA 5/5/1865 and released. 5'10" cmplx. fair, hair light, eyes blue. Postwar he was a miller, a member of the SANCSM, and a resident of the MLCSH. D. 7/19/1905 at the Homeopathic Hospital in Baltimore, aged 65, bur. at Loudon Park Cem., Baltimore. His obituary appeared in the *Baltimore Sun* 7/20/1905.

MCCLURE, THOMAS: Enl. 6/1/1862 for war at Richmond, VA. Present to 6/30/1863. Absent deserted 11/1/1863. NFR.

MCCUMMINS, FRANCIS: 1860 cen.: res. Cecil County, age 15, s., lived with his parents and five siblings. Enl. 10/24/1861 for one year in Co. K, 9th VA Cav. at Fort Lowry, VA. Present to 1/1/1863. Enl. 4th MD Art., 7/21/1864 for war at Petersburg, VA. Present to 2/28/1865. Cptd. at Petersburg 4/3/1865 and sent to Hart Island, NY. OOA 6/20/1865 and released. 5'10" cmplx. light, hair dark, eyes gray. After the war he was a driver in Washington, DC. D. 1/24/1924 aged 68, bur. at Arlington National Cemetery, VA.

MCELWEE, ANDREW J. ("A.J."): 1860 cen.: res. 1st Ward, Baltimore City, age 22, laborer, s., lived with his mother and two siblings. Enl. for war 5/28/1862 at Richmond, VA. Present to 6/30/1863. Absent, deserted 11/1/1863. NFR.

METTEE, CHARLES H.: Enl. for war 8/15/1861 in Baltimore Light Artillery (2nd MD Artillery) at Richmond, VA. Present to 1/1/1862. Adm. to G.H. No. 7/2/1862, diarrhea; returned to duty 7/20/1862. Enl. for the war 7/17/1863 in Co. F, 1st Maryland Cavalry Battalion in Richmond, VA. Present to 1/1/1864 "In Brigade Guard House." Present to 3/31/1864. Tnsfr. to 4th MD Artillery "date unknown, papers lost," but before 6/16/1864 when he signed a receipt roll for clothing as a member of the company. Present to 12/31/1864. Deserted 2/22/1865. NFR. Postwar he lived in Baltimore working as a paperhanger, married, and had nine children, only three of whom lived to adulthood. Adjutant for the James R. Herbert UCV Camp 657 in Baltimore and a member of the SANCSM. D. 6/21/1916, aged 70; bur. Loudon Park Cem., Baltimore.

MONTGOMERY, JOHN C.: B. at Baltimore 7/20/1842. Enl. 1/1/1862 for 1 year at Machodoc, VA. NFR. Was a resident of the MLCSH.

MOORE, JAMES THOMPSON ("DELAWARE"): B. 11/15/1831. 1860 cen.: res. Newcastle County, DEL, age 30, millwright, lived with his brother's family. Enl. 1/1/1862 for war at Machodoc, VA. Extra duty as a blacksmith 3/1-6/8/1863. Present to 12/31/1864. Appears to have been discharged. NFR. Married after the war to Martha Horn, had seven children. D. 4/22/1920 aged 88; bur. Forest Oak Cem., Gaithersburg.
